A Discussion on the Issue of Stigma: Encouraging Members to Face and integrate into Society

The purpose of this meeting is to encourage Phoenix Clubhouse members to tackle stigma against them, accept themselves, and seek their own happiness in life. Anybody can develop mental illness. When mentally ill, we have to learn to accept and face reality.

The meeting was led by Eva. Experienced Clubhouse members such as Rowena, Mimi and Kenneth shared with us their true stories and experiences. Though they have had mental illness for years, their optimistic attitude towards life is exactly what we should learn. They have been interviewed by the media in the hope of getting more people in society to understand mental illnesses, to reduce their prejudice against rehabilitated mental patients, and to give more opportunities and concern to them. We also invited Friends of Phoenix Clubhouse members Shirley and Stella to share their views on the issue of stigma.

When faced with stigma from society, many mental patients feel disturbed. The Clubhouse reminds us to be broad-minded and to accept the reality of mental illness. We also have to build up our self-confidence through studying and working, communicating more with family members, and talking with psychiatrists and social workers and the staff of Phoenix Clubhouse.

Among the members attending the meeting was Kitty. She shared with us her story: I remember that in the early days of my illness, I only bothered to take medication and see my psychiatrist regularly. When stressed or facing difficult times, I only sought to escape. Sheltered from the outside world, I felt alone. I was afraid to tell other people about my illness. Later on, however, I tried hard to breakthrough and contact the outside world. As a result, I made more friends. Taking this first step forward, I actually gained. I hope that people with my condition can face society and refrain from staying secluded or sheltered. I wish everybody the best of everything.

Administration Unit
